Suzette E. Sutherland '84, MD

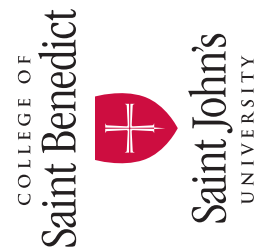

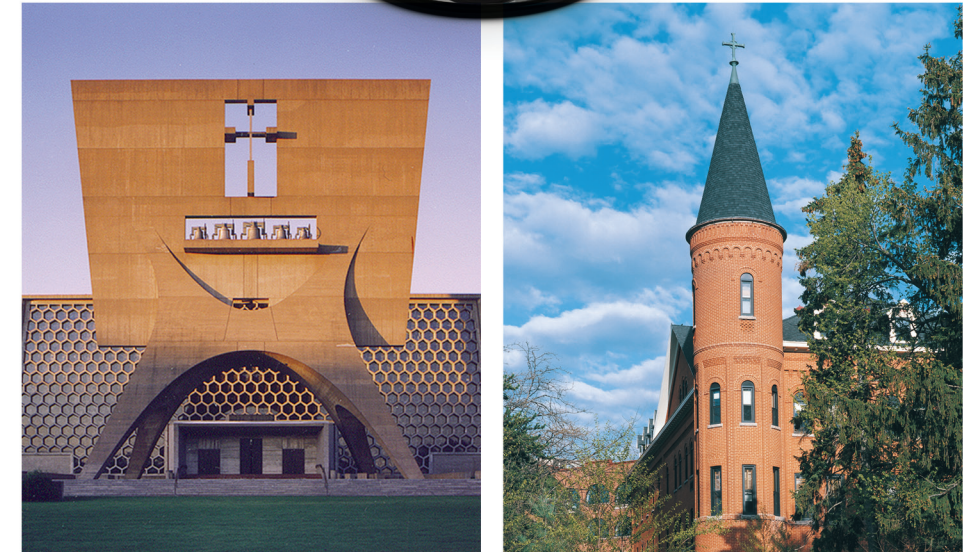
