Library Database User Authentication Change

The week of May 15th the Libraries are switching authentication methods for accessing ProQuest and EBSCO databases. Going forward patrons will use our campus SSO system (Azure AD). The first time you log in using this new system it will not automatically inherit your previously saved data based upon accounts you have created in the past. If you haven't saved anything, you don't need to pay attention to this email. If you have saved data in ProQuest or EBSCO, however, you can migrate your existing data to the new accounts using the methods outlined below.

For ProQuest:

Regular ProQuest databases won't be affected, but for eBook Central we need to submit requests on your behalf to ProQuest to migrate existing data. Please let me know if you would like your data migrated (you must have saved bookshelf data for this to work). If you have bookshelf data and would like to merge your bookshelves after the change, you may wish to make note of your current username *prior to the change* to make to bookshelf merge go more smoothly. This can be found under "Settings" > "Profile" in Ebook Central.
