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**GLOBAL LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT:**

**THEMES:**

Some courses are also designated with a Theme. There are three Themes: Truth, Justice, and Movement. A student must take at least three courses with the same Theme, from at least two different departments. At least one of these courses must be a Thematic Focus course. The other two required Themed courses can be Thematic Encounter courses at any level or Thematic Focus courses.
