TEACHING AND PEDAGOGY

Graduate Courses as Primary Instructor

THY 402: Introduction to the Christian Tradition I. 3 credits.

Saint John's School of Theology & Seminary, Collegeville, MN.

Fall, 2015, 1 on campus section of 14 students; 1 online section of 18 students.

Course Description: This course is an introductory survey of theology, studying representative texts from the pre-Christian era to eve of the Reformation (100 B.C. to 1450). Figures and issues will be situated within the philosophical and theological currents of their time.

Undergraduate Courses as Primary Instructor

THEO 1001: Introduction to Theology. 3 credits. Marquette University, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Fall, 2013, 2 sections of 19 students; Spring 2014, 1 section of 36 students.

Course Description: Key sources and questions of theology as reflection upon the worldview and core narrative found in Christian tradition and scriptures. Includes orientation to the academic study of religion. Background in theology is not presupposed. Prerequisite to all other courses in theology.

A grant from the Wabash Foundation funded this pilot. In the fall semester, 12 sections (each 19 students) met with an instructor on Monday/Friday, and all together (226 students) on Wednesday to hear a common lecture. The second semester, the Monday/Friday sections had 38 students.

THEO 111: The Biblical Tradition. 4 credits. College of Saint Benedict / Saint John's University, Collegeville, Minnesota. Fall 2007 and Spring 2008 semesters, 35 students each.

Course Description: This course offers an introduction to the discipline of Christian theology, giving primary attention to texts from the Bible (including selections from the Pentateuch, the Prophets, the Gospels, and the Pauline Letters), emphasizing prominent biblical themes (including creation, covenant, and reign of God), and considering some post-biblical developments in the tradition.

I developed an experimental format for this course with another instructor. Two sections with separate instructors were paired, and met together six times over the course of the semester for lectures and large-group activities with both instructors.

This section was redesigned to serve Marquette's Chinese exchange students who often lack the cultural knowledge of Christianity that aids their American colleagues in the Introduction to Theology course. I was

an active and regular participant in the teaching of this course, and it provided numerous occasions for discussion of both pedagogy and cultural issues.

• THEO 2530 Theology and Economics

Spring, 2013

CC 110: Texts and Contexts I: Traditions of Human Thought. 8 Credits. First-Year Program, Christ College, Valparaiso University, Valparaiso, Indiana. Fall 2001, 8 students.

As a tutorial assistant, I met with eight first-year students for one of their 8 classroom hours each week. Responsibilities included introducing students to the topics under discussion for the week, leading preliminary discussion of texts, evaluating and providing feedback on weekly written assignments, and providing evaluations that were part of their final grade. Weekly preparatory meetings with the other tutorial assistants and a faculty mentor were also required.

Other Teaching Experience

<u>Do</u> *Try This at Home: A Practical Lenten Series on the Bible.* Lenten Series, St. Vincent de Paul Parish, Cottonwood, UT. Weekly, March 16 – April 13, 2011. Average of 55 participants.

I taught this weekly class and covered a variety of methods of interacting with the Bible, including prayer with scripture, ancient biblical interpretation, and the insights of biblical scholarship.

The Holy Longing and Church History. Adult Religious Education Series, Cathedral of the Madeleine, Salt Lake City, Utah. Weekly, Sept 12th 2010 – April 24th, 2011. Average of 20 participants.

I led this series, which split its time between a discussion of Ronald Rohlheiser's The Holy Longing, and sessions in which I presented lectures on Church history.

Seeing the Word: Praying with the Saint John's Bible. Lenten Series, Cathedral of the Madeline Salt Lake City, UT. Weekly, February 19 – March 18, 2010. Average of 45 participants.

In this weekly class, I introduced the monastic practice of Lectio Divina, along with reflection on the visual components of the Saint John's Bible. Based on materials provided by Liturgical Press, Collegeville, MN.

Practicing our Faith and Other Topics. Adult Religious Ed Series, Cathedral of the Madeline, Salt Lake City, Utah. Weekly, 13 September, 2009 – 11 April 2010. Average of 20 participants.

In this class, I led discussion of Dorothy C. Bass, ed., Practicing Our Faith: A Way of Life for a Searching People. (New York: Jossey-Bass, 1997). In addition, I presented seven lectures on topics including monastic and religious orders, liturgical year, sacrament of order, church, and salvation.
